FROM THE PASTOR

"I may struggle with personal gratitude. You may wrestle with giving thanks. quick glance at the news, however, demonstrates that we are failing at communal thanksgiving. We are anxious and angry, because we are haunted by nightmares of scarcity, dystopian fears that someone else is taking everything, that there is never enough, and we will never get what we think we deserve. In wealthv societies that fear is, in many ways, stoked by real economic inequality and political injustice, resulting in cravings for things we think will fill us, fix us, or make us forget our doubts and pain. This leads to all sorts of addictive behaviors with drugs, sex, alcohol, money, shopping, food, hoarding fears and violence. Our and disappointments mount, merging with those of our neighbors, and become the seedbed for politics of protection, limits, This is not a vision of a and rage. community of gratitude."

Diana Butler Bass: page XVIII of the Prologue of <u>Grateful: The Transformative</u> <u>Power of Giving Thanks</u>, 2018, HarperOne.

This quote is from our Advent Reading book. The author, Diana Butler Bass, makes the point early on in her book, based on research and public surveys, that as a society we know we should express gratitude, and we try and do that personally, but we are not nearly as attuned to communal gratitude. We much less regularly participate in words and actions that demonstrate gratitude for what others have given us in a larger communal sense, or offer our thanks to the wider community via specific acts of giving. If anything, we focus more on what we perceive people are taking from us. Thus, what has come to be known as the "gratitude gap."

In the season of Advent, as we prepare for God's great gift of the Incarnation, of God coming to us in the person of Jesus, it is important for us to look at this gratitude gap. We can feel personally grateful for what God has done for us, as individuals and as family

But do we feel grateful for what God units. has done for all of humanity? Are we willing to express our gratitude to God by showing gratitude for all of creation and all people, and working to uphold all God has given? Has everything in our lives become so business oriented that we view everything as a transaction? If someone gives me something, I say thanks and give them something of equal value back. The transaction is then complete. However, God's interactions with us are far from business transactions. God gives extravagantly, without expectation of equal return. God gives to the whole of humanity and creation without singling out one individual or group, hoping that such giving will serve as a model for humanity, a model we will try and follow.

Gratitude for the gifts our communal interactions produce is rare in these days. When life becomes a never-ending series of business transactions in which we become primarily interested in what benefits each of us as individuals then what benefits the whole, the common good, is lost. In the past we have found some balance between individualism and communal concern. Individualism by far holds sway now and we are feeling the negative impacts of that in all aspects of our lives. It does not have to be that way.

If we hold on to hope that the world can be different, that our interactions can be different, then we give ourselves the chance to see how people are giving without the expectation of receiving back, giving to the wider good. We see how we, as St. Paul's UCC, both give in this way and receive gifts in this way. We can be moved by this, shaped by this. We talk about this in Advent groups. We recognize this is how God created us to be and live. We hope and look with anticipation to see what else might happen.

And God quietly came into the world as a vulnerable and dependent infant. The wider community cared for this baby and family. This child grew and gave of himself, to one and all he met. He showed us how it could be done. This Advent, this Christmas we look for how God will come to us again, helping us to live in

this way as well. It is how the world is transformed.
