While the school year is winding down, life here at St. Paul's is not. Yes, summer is coming and hopefully some rest and relaxation too. And, as a Congregation we have some exciting opportunities before us. As a Congregation, we hope we can Worship together, with most people being able to participate, either at the early Service or the late one. In the summer we can all Worship together at one Service, at 9:15 AM, which will start on Sunday May 27.

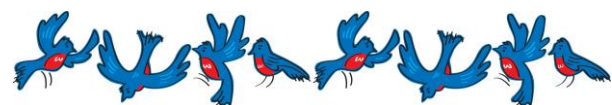

## **Neighbors Walking For a Healthy Community**

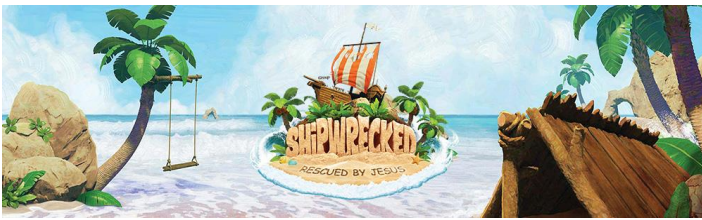
