FROM THE PASTOR

Is it really November? I imagine that is one of the many questions we will be asking each other over the next month. And please ask those questions because there is a lot happening. Our answers more than likely will be more detailed than the "Yes!" we offer to the above question, so please, please ask those questions.

The folks from Kirby-Smith Associates have been asking a number of questions and we are grateful for everyone's responses to their survey and to their requests for interviews. Our Congregation's response rate was higher than many others. This definitely helps us with our planning as we go forward. Our Dreams and Visions' responses continue to guide us, and these replies put even more flesh on them. We will be getting a report back from Kirby-Smith regarding their Feasibility Study the end of October. This study will guide us in estimating how much money we can raise for all our Dreams and Visions' projects and help us to prioritize.

We will be presenting this information on Sunday November 10 as part of our Stewardship Sunday activities (which include our Harvest Dinner and the final bidding on our Stewardship Baskets). You may certainly ask questions before that date, but this will be a time when we gather together to ask questions and plan the next steps forward. If at all possible, please plan on being here Sunday December 10.

We will be replacing the roof over our middle section or Sunday School wing of our Church. Bids were due in this week and work may well start in December. We recognize this is a less than ideal time, but the work needs to be done. The funding for this was previously okayed by our Congregation. Any questions you have about this roof, why it will look the way it will, why are we doing this one first, etc., please ask. We will fill you in.

I am sure you have other questions as well. Here are a few examples. Does Parish Ministries need help with decorating the Sanctuary for Advent? Yes, and Jonne

Dundore and others would be glad to talk with you more about that. May I still volunteer for the Green Team? Yes, and Eric Dundore or I would be glad to answer questions about what this entails. May I really go on some of the Confirmation "field trips" to other places of Worship? Yes, and Allyssa Boyer would be glad to answer questions about the when and where of those events. Is there going to be another Adult Bible Study like the Adult VBS this summer? Yes, on November 24 and you can speak with Allyssa or I about it. See what I mean, questions abound.

No matter how long you have been a part of St. Paul's or how new you are to our Congregations, it is crucial to ask your questions. No one here knows everything about everything that is going on, that is not how Congregations work. Someone knows more about specific goings-on, and they will be glad to share. One of the great skills we learn throughout our life is learning where to go and to whom to ask our questions. And then, to ask them. This is really a Biblical model. Just think, we probably would not have learned half of what Jesus had to teach us, if people did not ask him questions. Please ask away.


