**Attention – anyone who wants to make music!!**

The Choirs at St. Paul's are going to begin this year on **Wednesday, Sept. 5th** and we would love to have any and all with us to sing (or play hand chimes). These groups will meet on Wednesday evenings as follows:

- **Hand Chimes = 6:00 to 6:30 PM** in the Choir Room (any age – as long as you can hold and make sounds come from the chimes) No previous hand chime experience needed – we'll make you a pro in no time. We perform in church once a month. Mark Dundore will be directing again this year. Talk to him about your willingness to play!
- **Choristers = 6:30 to 7:00 PM** in the Choir Room (children in grades 1 thru 5) We hope that parents will continue to bring their children each week so that they can sing once a month at the late service. Jonne Dundore leads this group – please talk to her!

One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry(CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. This year, special consideration will be given to projects focusing on serving our immigrant neighbors and communities.
