LIGHT THE THREE PURPLE CANDLES

One: We often speak of shepherd and magi receiving the good news in this season, but they

were not the first. Was it a cow or ox, donkey or sheep, who found its manger occupied

with Love Incarnate? Were they the first to express their joy?

All: The Good News comes not just for humankind, but all of creation. Those
