

Chalking the Doors

On Epiphany, our children and youth will be chalking the doors and/or sidewalk of our church building. "Chalking the door" is a centuries-old tradition for Christians around the world. It is a way to celebrate and to (literally) mark the occasion of the Epiphany with God's blessing of our dwelling places with sacred signs and symbols that set our homes and churches apart as places of Christian hospitality, healing, and rest. Each year, Christians use chalk to mark their doors with an inscription of the new year separated by the letters C+M+B. This year, the inscription is 20+C+M+B+25. The C, M, and B stand for the Latin words *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, which means "May Christ bless this dwelling place." The letters also stand for the traditional names of the Magi who visited Christ: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. While our kids will be "chalking the doors" of our church building, please feel free to chalk your own doors at home!
