REAFFIRMATION OF OUR OPEN & AFFIRMING COVENANT (unison)

The people of God at St. Paul's United Church of Christ in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania, affirm our regard for the worth and dignity of all persons as beloved children of God. We recognize, celebrate, and give thanks for the many diverse gifts of God among us. We declare ourselves to be an Open and Affirming congregation, welcoming into full membership and participation in the Body of Christ persons of every race, language, age, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, physical or mental ability, and economic status.

We acknowledge that throughout history, the Christian church has often condemned and excluded gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and non-heteronormative people from the community of faith, or has condoned such condemnation and exclusion by its silence. We hold that such discrimination is incompatible with the gospel of Jesus Christ.

We commit ourselves to work diligently to end all oppression and discrimination that afflict God's people in our society. We commit ourselves to nondiscrimination in the full life, ministry, and sacraments of this church, including membership, leadership, and employment practices. We will condemn all acts of harassment, discrimination, and violence against God's people. We will seek to include and support those, who, because of fear and prejudice, find themselves in exile from a spiritual community. We affirm all relationships founded on

the principles of God's love and justice. We pledge ourselves to be a wellspring of faith for a diverse people.

This covenant was adopted by vote of the congregation on May 18, 2003. Terms revised and covenant reaffirmed by the congregation on May 20, 2018.

ONA Sunday Annual Celebration

United Church of Christ Open and Affirming Ministry Update Sunday, June 29, 2025

Today, we celebrate our denomination's annual recognition of the Open and Affirming Ministry. Last Sunday in June was selected to highlight the covenants of each ONA church and their support of their LGBTQIA+ members and individuals within their community.

The last Sunday in June is also the anniversary of the riot that occurred at the Stonewall Inn in Greenwich Village of New York City, NY on Sunday, June 28, 1969. The police raided the inn in the early morning hours of that day and the LGBTQ+ community fought back when the police became violent. This event brought to light the gay liberation movement of LGBTQIA+ rights in the United States.

We approved our Covenant on Sunday, May 18, 2003, becoming the 464th ONA church. We revised and reapproved our Covenant on Sunday, May 20, 2018 to reaffirm our commitment to our LGBTQIA+ church members and wider community. Each year we read our Covenant on the third Sunday of May to continue that relationship.

Within our 4,840+ church denomination there are 1,912 ONA churches and in our 38 conferences 27 are ONA. Since last year's ONA Sunday, we have celebrated churches within the Commonwealths and States of California, Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Vermont, Wisconsin and Washington D.C for becoming ONA.

We also celebrate the Indiana Kentucky Conference and the Southeast Association of the Michigan Conference for becoming ONA.

Our ONA Ministry continues to grow and thrive and is led nationally by the ONA Coalition located at our National Office in Cleveland, OH. The Rev. Derek Terry is the Acting Executive Director/Program Director and Ann Randall is the Finance Director. The website is www.onacoalition.org.

Shirley Keith Knox is our Convener and Steve Roush is the Coach leading the Penn Central Conference ONA Ministry Team. Steve also coaches' churches on their ONA journey remotely for the Penn Northeast, Penn Southeast, and Penn West conferences.

Here at St. Paul's, Shirley serves on The Welcome Team and Steve serves on the Social Justice Committee.

This ministry strives toward the day when all people can believe that they are fully welcomed and are **Beloved Children of God.**
