

LITURGY OF CONFESSION FOR AMERICAN INDIAN MINISTRY SUNDAY (responsive)

One: Gathered here on this holy ground, the psalmist reminds us that...

All: The earth is the Creator's, and everything in it — this world and all who live in it.

One: We confess that many who have come before us misrepresented holy scripture in order to dispossess indigenous inhabitants of their homes and sovereignty; obstructed divine authority to take these lands; and used treaties as tools of imperial exploitation. They forgot, but we must remember:

All: The earth is the Creator's, and everything in it — this world and all who live in it.

One: We confess the Doctrine of Discovery harms all it touches: the generations of those it has oppressed and the spirits of those who use it to oppress. Hope of healing calls us to remember...

All: The earth is the Creator's, and everything in it — this world and all who live in it.

One: We confess that as present-day residents of our precious Mother Earth, we have not been faithful stewards of her care, nor of the circle of life and all our relations, human and non-human. All Creation calls us to remember...

All: The earth is the Creator's, and everything in it — this world and all who live in it.

One: Let us pray together.

All: On this day we come, seeking divine forgiveness and holding ourselves accountable to live in faithfulness and reconciliation for the sake of the earth and seven generations. Amen.

The Liturgy of Confession and Words of Assurance are adapted from "Confession: American Indian Ministry Sunday" written for the 29th General Synod of the United Church of Christ, by the Rev. Ann Jefferson, Pastor, and

Director of Community Life and Pastoral Care, Pacific School of Religion, and member of City of Refuge UCC in Oakland, CA.

The 29th General Synod of the United Church of Christ approved a Resolution of Witness calling for the UCC to repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery, which authorized the genocide of Native people and the theft of native lands. In that Resolution we recognize the complicity of the Churches, including the UCC, in the perpetration of these injustices. In the spirit of repentance which that Resolution calls for, we offer this moment of confession and prayerful reconciliation. In the hope of healing and deepening of relationship with Native peoples, we welcomed into our midst a local leader in the Native American Community, the Rev. Bruce Kafer (Oglala Lakota), who offered a brief reflection and healing song. Following his prayer, the congregation joined in this prayer of confession.

The reading of the Psalm is from "First Nations Version Psalms and Proverbs: An Indigenous Bible Translation," Downers Grove, IL: InterVarsity Press, 2025.

The reading of the Gospel and the Lord's Prayer are all from "First Nations Version: An Indigenous Translation of the New Testament," Downers Grove, IL: InterVarsity Press, 2021.

This dynamic equivalence translation of the Christian Scriptures imagines how these sacred texts might speak if they were being told in the tradition of Indigenous storytellers using the practices of oral cultures. Created by a translation council made up of a group of Native North Americans diverse in tribal affiliation, age, gender and denomination, the FNV seeks a faithful rendering of the original text through the cultural lens of Native Americans. It is an invitation to see how God is still speaking in ancient and traditional ways at the intersections of sacred scripture and indigenous spirituality, experiences, and storytelling.

The Prayer of Dedication is adapted from "Native American Ministries Sunday Liturgy," The United Methodist Church, 2023. The World Peace Prayer is a paraphrase of a verse from the Upanishads, the most ancient scriptures of Hinduism, also prayed daily by Roman Catholic Benedictine nuns.
