

One: We name the fear that may reside in us; fear of ourselves and fear of the other. And we proclaim that we do not need to be afraid. Christ reigns in mercy and justice, guiding our feet into the way of peace.

All: You, O God, love everyone. We are all Your beloved. Amen.

CALL TO CONFESSION

Imagining Christ's reign can be difficult. It is difficult to picture a world governed by God's justice and righteousness alone. Our minds are held captive by the worst images of human kings, rulers,

and powers. When nobler visions fail, we settle for kingdoms of our own making, which tend to be too narrow, too insular, for the breadth and splendor of God's great creation.
