he will enfold all people in his mercy.

All: With gladness, we join our voices with the prophet Isaiah, who proclaims that God

values, and invites us to live flourishing lives.

One: We light this candle of joy as a sign of God's joyful spirit which enlivens us as we wait

and work for the day when all creation will flourish together.
