

#### FROM THE PASTOR

It has been 23 months since our lives were upended by the COVID-19 pandemic. In all that time, our lives, and the lives of our neighbors around the world, have changed dramatically. The way we work, the way we go to school, the way we socialize, the way we worship; it seems as though every aspect of our lives together has been altered in some way because of this disease. Our congregation responded, and continues to respond, to the hardships and disruptions caused by COVID-19. In a time of great anxiety and loneliness, you have helped us to weather the storm. You adjusted to changes in nearly all of our ministries. You persevered, knowing that the work we do together as the Body of Christ is important. I am overwhelmed by the compassion and the care that you've shared within our community and beyond over these past two years. Still, I know that it is exhausting. I know that it can feel discouraging, that when it seems like we've made progress in defeating this disease, another variant crops up and more people become sick, and, tragically, more people die. Like many others, I have turned to our faith for solace and guidance. The Psalms, in particular, have been a comfort. The writer of Psalm 46 writes, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, ... The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge." The knowledge that God is with us throughout all of this, that we do not need to be afraid, that has been a great comfort to me. When everything around us seems to be in a constant state of change, I am grateful for a God who is steadfast, a refuge from our troubles. I am also grateful for a congregation that continues to serve as a refuge for others.

One of the incredible gifts of being part of a congregation is that none of us needs to walk the journey of faith alone. You have continued to give your time and resources to the ministries of our church. And you have cared for one another, offering assistance with meals, rides to medical appointments, messages of wellbeing, continued support for local missions like the Ecumenical Food Pantry and New Hope Ministries, and the gift of your presence in worship (in person and online). This February, as we brave the icy cold mornings and the dark evenings, let us continue to support one another in the sure knowledge that God is with us always; we are not alone.



It begins with a foundation on approaching racism as a public health crisis, and then dives into specific issues and topics. The final lessons offer a variety of approaches to inspire ways to take action in your own ministries and work. This course grew out of the Resolution of Witness declaring racism as a public health crisis that CHHSM and the UCC Council on Racial and Ethnic Ministries (COREM) are brought to General Synod 2022 this past summer.



The Harrisburg YWCA is sponsoring its 18<sup>th</sup> Annual Race Against Racism.

This year, we'll lead up to the Race Against Racism with a 21-Day Racial Equity and Social Justice Challenge, which begins April 1!

More than 700 participants of the Racial Equity & Social Justice Challenge joined the YWCA last year to build better racial and social justice habits, including 24 members of St. Paul's!

The Race Against Racism is a mission-driven event promoting awareness of racism in our

St. Paul's will be participating in this challenge and virtual race again, through our team St. Paul's on the Run. Any member of St. Paul's can join our team and can participate in the 21-day challenge and/or the race as well. Kathy Aumiller will be acting as Team Leader again this year.
