FROM THE PASTOR

Lent is upon us. This is now the third year (I think—time feels mashed together) where Covid will be impacting what we are doing. As has been true for so much, Lent, like life, continues to happen, and it is up to us to adjust as to how we will safely participate in it. And we are called to look at this time, the forty-day journey, and ask ourselves: what will I do during this time to draw closer to God, so each of us may more clearly hear God's reassurance, peace and love, and God's unique calls to us.

While Lent is a time of self-reflection, we may not have recognized how previously we did this self-reflection in the company of each other. Being part of a Congregation, a Community of Faith, reminds us we do not walk this path alone. When we are able to gather, we are reminded by each other's presence that our journeys are encouraged, supported, and sustained through each other's presence. And our concrete bodily presence with each other, also reminds us of God's Presence with us, that God's Spirit is within us, accompanying and guiding us. We do not travel alone.

Lenten devotionals are available again. You may have old ones or books that have devotions within. Pick something and try to read it each day. The disciple of such a daily practice enables us to better engage in other disciplines: prayer, meditation, walking meditation, times of silent reflection. It also helps us to more regularly engage in other actions that are geared toward helping others.

The Lenten reading group will be meeting again. We will meet in-person in the afternoon. We are still looking at whether an evening group, either in-person or via Zoom is something people want to do. If you are interested in such a gathering, please let us know. We will have an Ash Wednesday Service inperson this year. We will also offer the Imposition of Ashes outside in the morning, in a "drive-through" fashion. Please look for the time that will be offered.


Our Lenten Sunday Services will be focused on this journey we are making, alone and together. Each Sunday will have a particular focus on aspects of our journeys.

Our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday Services will be structured differently this year.

We will have a Sunrise Service; the location is still to be determined. Easter, the celebration of new life will reveal itself again this year. We will need to be paying attention, so we get to experience it.

There are ways we can participate together. I hope we will choose, always keeping our health and the health of others in mind, to engage in our Lenten journeys with each other, remembering our presence points to the Presence of God within us, among us and through us.



ASH WEDNESDAY

Last year we offered "Mobile Ashes" or "Ashes to Go" in order to give as many people as possible a chance to participate in the Imposition of Ashes. This year we will have an in-person Ash Wednesday Service at 7:30 PM and we still wanted to offer the other option of receiving ashes for those unable to come to the Service or who feel uncomfortable Worshipping together.

We will offer the Imposition of Ashes from 7:30-10:00 AM. Pastor Allyssa, Rev. Karin and perhaps other Ministers in our Congregation will be serving you.

Our plan is to station ourselves at the portico entrance (by the kitchen). People can drive up and stay in their cars; we will reach in and impose ashes on foreheads or hands, as requested by each individual. The Imposition of Ashes will be accompanied by a very brief prayer and the traditional words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." We will be masked and will use hand sanitizer. We will ask all who drive up to be wearing a mask.
