FROM THE PASTOR

We are in the season of Easter, Eastertide officially. This is the time between Easter and Pentecost. It lasts 50 days. Perhaps because we are all “celebrated out” after Easter baskets, eggs, candy, and beautiful flowers, we tend not to focus on this season too much. Without more focus on Eastertide though, we risk celebrating Jesus’ resurrection on Easter Sunday and then putting it out of our minds as we return to our daily responsibilities.

The Rev. Richard Gordon shared at a recent Zoom meeting that in this season we are in a “Resurrection Place.” This is a designated time for us to focus on resurrection, on new life. We are blessed to be able to connect Jesus’ resurrection to eternal life with God for all people. We can believe the end of our physical lives, and the end of our loved ones’ physical lives are not the end of our existence. There is more. While we do not know for sure what that more is, we have been given clues to reflect on. This is a season for such reflection. Eternity, we are told, is a time and space with no more pain, no more separation from loved ones and God, and a time and space of feasting, contentment, rest, and joy.

Believing in resurrection can help free us to live our lives with more courage, more openness, more concern for others rather than self-centered focus that can come from believing this life is all we get. Believing in resurrection can help us see that new life is possible in this life as well. When our struggles, fears, loneliness, and pain feel like they are our lot in this life, believing in resurrection can help us see that does not need to be true. While there is pain associated with change, with “dying” to old ways of believing, thinking, and acting, there is new life on the other side. We cannot know for sure what this new life will be like, but we know Jesus is with us, God is with us, as we make those transitions into lives that are more reflective of God’s hopes for us, more filled with fulfillment, peace, and love.

Let us inhabit this “Resurrection Place” for the rest of Eastertide. Let us reflect on resurrection and what it can mean for us and for the communities we are a part of, and the whole of Creation. May we all experience a Blessed Eastertide.

Church Security

In the next month or two, we will be calling a Congregational Meeting. At that meeting we will be discussing security issues, primarily related to the locking of our doors during our gathering together on Sunday.

This meeting will be a time of discussion, speaking and listening. There will be no votes taken. Suggestions will be noted and then discussed by our Security Team and Consistory.

I share this now because we all need to practice how we will engage in this discussion. For the vast majority of us, we will be asked to participate in ways different than we are used to. Each person who is willing to share will be asked to speak from their personal perspective, giving as much context or background as they feel comfortable. While one person is speaking, the rest of us will be actively listening. That means we will be trying as best we can to hear what our fellow parishioner is sharing, where they are coming from. We want to gain a greater understanding of why people feel the way they do about keeping the doors locked or unlocked during Worship and Sunday School. People have different perspectives. No one perspective is right or wrong. We are not to try and convince another person that our point of view is correct and theirs is not. Therefore, it is not anyone’s task to tell another person they are wrong or respond in ways that would indicate another person’s position is foolish or unrealistic or an extreme minority point of view. This is not a debate, where one position or another will be declared the “winner.”

Consistory members, responding to concerns that were raised, have been speaking with the committees they are liaisons to and various individuals. They have asked for feedback from folks and have gotten varied responses. Some excellent suggestions were raised, and we will be investigating their viability. These varying points of view, some very passionately stated, also point to our need for a wider shared discussion. Consistory members reported back during last month's Consistory meeting, and it was agreed by Consistory to arrange a meeting with the Security Team to share these responses and to listen to the Security Team members thoughts. After that meeting, a date will be selected for our Congregational Meeting.

Our Security Team has done an excellent job in responding to the concerns about security that were raised during our Dreams and Visions discussions a few years ago. Based on the number of concerns raised, we designated monies from the Dreams and Visions Campaign to increase security through new door locking systems, cameras, and remote access systems. Much of this was installed during the time we were not meeting in person due to Covid. As we have returned to in-person Worship, meetings and gatherings, people have raised some concerns about whether this increased security matches our vision for St. Paul's to be a place where all feel welcome. Both our desire for being welcoming and for providing a safe and secure place are in keeping with our mission and vision. How we best balance these desires is our point of discussion.

The intention of our Congregation Meeting will be to better understand each other and where people with differing points of view are coming from, so we can best find that balance. We want to give everyone a chance to have their voice be listened to and respected. We know in advance that not everyone will feel as if they are getting what they want and believe to be in the best interest of all. Still, being heard and having our opinions respected goes a long way to helping all feel like they are valued parts of our faith community. The more diversity in a group, the more diversity of opinions. Learning to live into this reality, live with this reality, is also a part of our mission and vision. We do not see it modeled too often in our current political and social discussions. We can do better.

We need to do better, so we can model another way of interacting as we go beyond our walls.

If you have any questions about this, please talk to me or Pastor Allyssa, or talk to a Consistory member. The more participation we have in this Congregational Meeting, the better understanding we will have about where each other are coming from and why we feel the way we do. Such understanding helps us grow together. Such understanding helps lead to new life.
