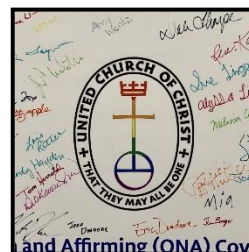
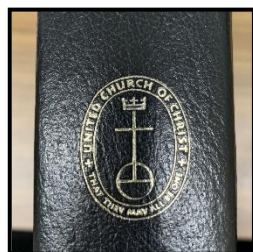
Spotlight on Sacred Art

In this feature of our monthly epistle, we highlight symbols, emblems, and other aspects of our church's art and architecture, explain their meaning, and reveal a little about their history. This month, our spotlight is on the **large pine cross** in the sanctuary, and the **cross, crown, and orb**, the traditional emblem of the United Church of Christ.

The **large pine cross** that hangs above the altar table is the focal point of our worship space. The pine cross was hand-hewn with a broadaxe in Vermont. It measures 12 x 6 feet and weighs 250 pounds. The cross is suspended using the same type of industrial wire used to control ailerons, the "fins" on the trailing edges of airplane wings. It was hung when construction on our current sanctuary was completed in 1976. The Rev. Dr. Tom Herrold, our Pastor Emeritus, recalls that the contractor asked him if he really wanted "that old rugged cross" hung, perhaps implying that the sanctuary was too beautiful for such a rough-hewn piece of wood. Tom affirmed that indeed it was to be hung.



The traditional emblem of the United Church of Christ is the **cross, crown, and orb**, enclosed within a double oval bearing the name of the church and Jesus's prayer, "That they may all be one" (John 17:21). The Gospel verse reflects our historic commitment to the restoration of unity among the separated churches of Jesus Christ. The emblem is based on an ancient Christian symbol known as the Cross of Victory or the Cross Triumphant. The crown symbolizes the sovereignty of Christ. The cross recalls the suffering of Christ. The orb, divided into three parts, evokes the Trinity, and reminds us of Jesus's command to be his "witnesses...to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). There are cross, crown, and orb emblems throughout our church (not all pictured here). Can you find these eight?
