



HARVEST DINNER


November 13th, following the 10:30AM service. Parish Ministries will serve roast turkey, a side-dish of roasted vegetables, and beverages. Place settings will be provided. There is no charge for this dinner, instead bring a non-perishable food item or two, which in turn will be given to New Hope Ministries. SPRING ANNOUNCEMENT

We are coming into another cold and flu season and viruses abound. Our focus for the past two years has been on COVID. Now that we are taking our masks off, we are seeing the return of our old viral foes.

RSV has spread aggressively throughout our communities resulting in overflowing pediatric hospital units. RSV can also affect adults. Middle aged adults will get a stuffy nose, sore throat, and bronchitis. Older adults can develop more severe respiratory symptoms. Influenza is off to an early start, and we expect lots of cases. COVID continues to mutate. There are three variants, BQ.1.1, BQ.1, and BF.7, that are spreading in Europe and in the US. All are direct descendants of Omicron, and we expect the bivalent booster to provide protection. How much protection remains to be seen.

How to stay safe. Get your influenza and bivalent COVID vaccines ASAP. The bivalent COVID booster will provide excellent protection from severe disease and probably less protection from mild disease. The influenza vaccine should provide reasonable protection from the flu. Unfortunately, there is no vaccine for RSV. Masking remains a very effective way to limit the spread of respiratory viruses. We don't feel that masking should be mandatory in the Church given the protections offered by vaccination. We continue support anyone's choice to wear a mask and continue to encourage the use of hand hygiene. Masking remains particularly important for those who are at high risk of complications related to infection.
